The mission of Boulware Mission, Inc. is to help displaced individuals become self sufficient through education, treatment, and services.

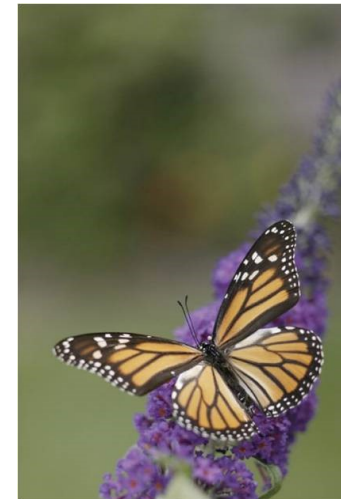

About Us

Boulware Mission offers long term, comprehensive services for (near) homeless men and women. Boulware primarily serves the Green River Area Development District (GRADD) of Western Kentucky which includes the counties of Daviess, Hancock, Henderson, McLean, Ohio, Union, and Webster. The shelter is located in Owensboro, KY.

The services provided by Boulware Mission are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Boulware provides clients with 3 nutritious meals per day, snacks, emergency clothing,

personal hygiene items, and case management services in a safe and supportive environment.

Clients are accepted for services without regard to age, race, sex, national origin, religious affiliation, sexual orientation, or physical or mental impairment. Boulware is not, however, a medical or assisted living facility and is not equipped to serve individuals who need assistance with daily independent living activities.

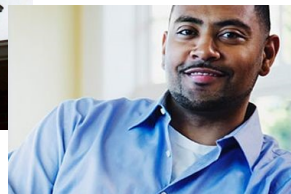

- Served 334 Residential Displaced Clients
- Average Length of Stay Was 71 Days
- Served 120 Public Outpatient Treatment Clients
- 17% of Residents Were Disabled
- 6% of Residents Were Veterans
- 15% Had No High School Diploma
- 80% Had Problems with Drugs/Alcohol
- 68% Attended On-Site Treatment Program
- 82% of those Able to Work Became Employed
