CLIENT SPOTLIGHT: A CLIFF NOTE

The philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche was quoted as saying, "That which does not kill us makes us stronger." This statement would apply to many of Boulware's clients, including Clifton Davis.



Cliff came to Boulware Mission after his life hit rock bottom in June of 2016. The good thing about hitting rock bottom, is that there is nowhere to go but up.

While residing at the Mission, Cliff went through the substance abuse treatment program and entered recovery from drugs and alcohol. He attended employment skills and financial literacy classes and eventually started working again.

Amidst all of the changes taking place in his life, putting

his thoughts and feelings on paper became part of Cliff's personal therapy.

After a while, he began sharing his words of wisdom with friends at the Mission and before long, others began to show interest in his writings. Soon they were being sent to acquaintances and shared by people Cliff hadn't even met.

This continued even after Cliff moved out of the Mission, at which point there were over one hundred people receiving his daily texts.

One of Cliff's readers suggested that his writings be published, then one thing led to another and God provided a way for Cliff to share his heart beyond daily text messages.

Cliff's first book, *A Cliff Note* is being published by Christian Faith Publishing and will be available in January of 2018. *A Cliff Note* is a compilation of his notes of inspiration and encouragement.

Cliff wrote this book in order to reach out to others who have found themselves in situations similar to what he has gone through. With a humble spirit, Cliff said, "My hope for my readers is to remind each of you that YOU are not alone in the struggles of life. I hope that my thoughts will, in some way, help you face each new day with a greater strength and a more positive outlook."

Cliff's story is a reminder of how strong one can become amidst the valleys of life and we are excited to announce his new book to you, our supporters!

OPPORTUNITIES TO HELP

Most often, when people first come to Boulware, they need help with overcoming unhealthy lifestyle patterns that have contributed to their current situation. Boulware offers a comprehensive continuum of services to help guide clients from 'where they are' to 'where they want to be' - that is, healthy, productive individuals.

This time of year, we receive lots of calls inquiring about how people within the community can help.

Boulware relies on volunteers to assist with many of the services we provide. We utilize volunteers to teach classes, lead

Bible studies, cook and serve meals, answer phones and help with basic client needs.

If volunteering is not a possibility, we are always in need of in-kind donations. Things such as personal hygiene items, postage stamps, and cleaning and office supplies are constant needs and the *Messenger-Inquirer* publishes a current wish list each month.

Finally, the biggest need for help is for funding. The majority of Boulware's operating income comes from private donations. That is why our faithful supporters are so important to us.

Without funding, we could not equip people right here in our community with the tools they need to be successful.

GOOD THINGS CONT'D

So far in '17, we've had the privilege of serving 289 residential clients; 160 of whom have completed substance abuse treatment, entering recovery from drugs and alcohol. An impressive 84% took advantage of our on-site financial literacy course, learning how to budget, how to make better use of their money, and how to repair their credit. Many have even been able to pay off debt and save for the future.

We had a door opened to us this year presenting the opportunity to open an all-female substance abuse treatment program.

The program is led by women for women and focuses on the unique challenges and needs that women in addiction face.

Coupled with the treatment program, these women also receive the other benefits of Boulware's Self-Sufficiency program that are usually reserved for residential clients, which include case management services, financial literacy classes, and employment skills.

The program is open to the public and offers participants the ability to live at home while going through a licensed treatment program.

Because of this program, we have been able to serve more women from Daviess County in the last several months than we served from Daviess County in all of last year!

Boulware was the recipient of grants from two sources, the Owensboro Health Community Health Investment Grant and the Kentucky Bar Foundation, to help fund this important project.

In addition to the women's treatment program, we have expanded our services to residential men by introducing a transitional phase to our program with a goal of helping them to better prepare for the next steps of moving out on their own.

Clients in the transitional phase are given more time and freedom to integrate back into community and family while still living

in a structured environment. This opportunity allows more time for growth and enhances clients' chances of lasting recovery.

Finally, Boulware has been blessed throughout the year by partnerships with local businesses and individuals that have helped us succeed in making a difference in our clients' lives.

Earlier in the year, Boulware Mission was honored to be recognized by one of our partners as the *Greater Owensboro Chamber of Commerce 2017 Non-Profit of the Year*. This award means a lot to the Mission and has allowed for some special opportunities for community awareness.
