New Employee Spotlight—Kathy Oakley-Huitt

Boulware Mission is proud to introduce new Counselor/Case Manager, Kathy Oakley-Huitt, to the facility as of August 11, 2021. Boulware CEO Amy Pride says, "Kathy is now responsible for treatment classes, working with the clients, and case management, along with a continuum of care for 90-120 days following treatment, through the transition phase. We are thrilled to have someone with her background and credentials joining our team."

Kathy was born in Benton, raised in Calvert City, Kentucky and graduated from Marshall County High School. She went on to earn her Bachelors and Masters Degrees from Murray State. She completed all her class work towards a Doctorate but never presented her dissertation due to career moves and life changes.

Kathy is a Navy Veteran and served for 6 years in Jacksonville, Florida. She spent the next 32 years in the addiction and recovery field working at a Psychiatric Hospital, as a Level 5 Boys Psychiatric Treatment Counselor, in Private Practice and with the University of Kentucky as a Targeted Assessment Specialist.

While working for 6 years with Opiate addicts in Pawley's Island, South Carolina, Kathy was a volunteer for Celebrate Recovery. Although she loved the work that she was doing there, she had to take a break around 4 years ago. Unfortunately, Kathy suffered a tremendous personal loss when her brother passed away from a heroin overdose and then losing her mother only 2 days later. It was then that she started to reevaluate her life and where she could be

most useful. She never truly felt connected to the SC community enough to make a difference for her clients. Kathy stated, "I always felt that I could be of more service if I were back in Kentucky where I actually had connections and more treatment facilities were available to refer to. Residential treatment is so rare and Boulware simultaneously offers the two things that work best for recovery clients: treatment and housing. In 32 years, I've never witnessed a community that comes together around recovery to help those in need like I've seen in Owens-

Boulware is fortunate that Kathy's life came full circle back to our area so that she was able to come to Owensboro to join her best

> friend who is also in the treatment community. Boulware Program Director, Harold Richardson, says "We are fortunate that Kathy comes in with so many years of experience and know that she will greatly benefit Boulware, especially our clients."

Kathy's experience, combined with the other members of the Boulware Treatment Team, totals over 92 years of experience in the field. Boulware is

blessed to have a treatment team that has dedicated their lives and careers to helping those who are in need of shelter, treatment, and recovery.

The first point of contact for our clients is Admissions & Volunteer Coordinator, Cari Addington. Case Manager, Stan Overfield, is responsible for peer groups and charting. The Treatment Program Director is Harold Richardson, who has been with Boulware since 2005.
